The Boat Race is a famous race in the UK. It's a rowing race between Oxford University and Cambridge University. Both teams wear blue: Oxford wears dark blue and Cambridge wears light blue. The rowers are students, and there are eight rowers and a cox in each team. The cox is the person who tells the rowers which way to go.

The first boat race between Oxford and Cambridge was in 1829. The Oxford rowers were the winners. In the past, the race was only for men, but today there are two races every year; one for women and one for men. The races are on the last Sunday in March or the first Sunday in April.

The Boat Race is always on the same part of the River Thames in London. The start is at Putney Bridge, and the finish is 6.8km further up the river near Chiswick Bridge. On the day of the race, there's always a big crowd. More than 250,000 people watch the race from the side of the river, and another 15 million watch it on TV.
